Join us for our 175th Celebration!

First Baptist Church has been a community-focused congregation from its very beginning, when eight men and twelve women met with delegates from other Wisconsin Baptist churches on December 23, 1847 to organize the Baptist Society of Wisconsin.

For 175 years, this church has shared its leaders and buildings with our neighbors, supporting the good work of non-profit organizations and faith communities of our city. Our congregation has been at the forefront of social justice by welcoming Japanese members during World War II, supporting the Civil Rights Movement, counseling students protesting the Vietnam War, working for separation of church and state, and advocating for the full inclusion of marginalized groups.



On September 18 during our regular worship service, we celebrate the common thread that runs through our past, present, and future endeavors—our love of God and love of neighbor.

Join us as we honor the past, celebrate the present, and embrace the future of this congregation through scripture, story, music, and ritual. We will be joined by the FBC handbell choir and guest musicians “Beltline Bones.” You’ll hear reflections from our Pastor Emeritus, Rev. Mark Clinger, we’ll honor our Pastor Emeritus and Handbell Director Emerita, and we will celebrate the joining of new members.

As always, this service will be livestreamed for those who cannot attend in person. However you choose to participate, we hope to see you for this very special event in the life of our church!

FROM YOUR MODERATOR

New in the Fall...more people in the building at First Baptist.

In keeping with the congregation’s desire to open our church building to community use, the Trustees are happy to report that we have new building use agreements in place with the Madison Metropolitan School District (MMSD), Madison School Community Recreation (MSCR), and Madison Friends of International Students (MFIS). These groups (and others) will be mostly utilizing third floor classroom spaces.

Among other offerings, there will be alternative classes for high school students, exercise classes for older people, art classes, and classes for English Language Learners. Our community groups have agreed to hourly fees for classroom use.

Community building users must be Not-for-Profit Organizations with proof of insurance. Their values and mission statements must compliment the values and mission of First Baptist. Don’t forget that church members can still make their own building use arrangements with the church office. In most cases, church members can arrange to use classrooms and other spaces at no cost.

FROM FBC'S BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Update from the August 2022 Meeting

Here is a summary of FBC's Board of Trustees' August meeting:

- 1) We received the quarterly report from our Investment and Planned Giving subcommittee presented by subcommittee chair Wynn Davies (reported separately in this *Visitor*)
- 2) We reviewed and endorsed our current COVID mitigation policies (which remain unchanged) while seeking guidance regarding when facemasks may become optional and when food can return for church events.
- 3) I mentioned last month that we have implemented policies with our staff to minimize cyber fraud. This is an increasingly common problem – and we became one of its victims when \$2,200 of salary was deposited in a fraudulent account before the fraud was identified. The “good news” is that it is a “relatively” small amount. The “bad news” is that it is too small to be reimbursed by insurance!
- 4) Many people from FBC – Trustees and others – have been working to get our pandemic-emptied rooms ready for our renters as well as our own use. Thanks to all of you for your many hours of labor!
- 5) Our monthly review of the budget again shows items under, over, and on budget – surprise! In some over-budget categories (maintenance) there will be a saving in the long run, and some expected over-budget areas (electricity and heating) should be offset by increased rental income.

FROM YOUR RACIAL JUSTICE TEAM

Are we still going to talk about this?



Again? Yes! Our racial justice path continues, through an upcoming series scheduled this fall and winter.

Following our previous reading of Jamar Tisby's book [The Color of Compromise](#) last winter, The Racial Justice Team (RJT) invites you to continue this journey as we reflect on the author's recent interview, *Three Words Should Guide our Pursuit of Racial Justice*, which asks us to consider “what next?” What does it mean to reckon with racism in our own lives and in the lives of our faith communities? We will delve into what Tisby sees as the essential elements of all genuine racial reconciliation, namely the ARC (awareness, relationships, commitment) model. Together we will consider his ideas as well as how to implement meaningful change, with plenty of time for discussion in both small and larger groups.

All meetings will be held virtually, from **7 - 8:30 PM** on the following dates:

- **September 18** - we will refresh our memories and knowledge about some of the larger concepts discussed in Mr. Tisby's book [The Color of Compromise](#).
- **October 16** - we will discuss potential next steps for promoting social justice at FBC.
- **November 20** - we will plan our next steps, both as individuals and as a congregation.
- **January 2023** – we will begin a plan to implement the steps we have agreed upon.

Doing Good While Doing Well

Did you know that at least 20% of First Baptist's financial assets are invested in "socially responsible" investments?

For example: Self Help Federal Credit Union, which targets its loans and other financial services to low income neighborhoods in Milwaukee. Forward Community Investments is another of our socially responsible investments that makes loans primarily to non-profits throughout Wisconsin that provide affordable housing and economic opportunity for low income communities.

Last week your Board of Trustees approved the investment of an additional \$7,000 in The Wisconsin Council of Churches "Community Investment Program" (increasing it to \$10,000). This program will, in turn, invest our money in seven non-profit "Community Development Financial Institutions" serving minority communities and women-owned business startups throughout our state.

Have you considered investing some of your own financial assets in socially responsible investments? We would be pleased to give you some ideas. For example, our investment in the Council of Churches program earns better than the money you may have invested in money market or savings accounts (it has averaged 2.17 % in recent years) and has an excellent record of keeping our investment "safe" avoiding the fluctuations of the stock market. And with the added advantage of knowing that your money is doing "good" while it is doing "well". Members of the Investment and Planned Giving Committee will be pleased to provide you with more information on how you can join First Baptist in placing some of your own money in "socially responsible investments".

Opportunity to Support Two ABC Ministries

September is the month that our Board of Christian Outreach has designated as an opportunity to support American Baptist Ministries around the world through the **World Mission Offering** and to remember those who have served us here and abroad by supporting the **Retired Ministers and Missionaries Offering**.

The **World Mission Offering** helps support more than 70 global servants serving in Iberoamerica and the Caribbean, Africa, Europe, the Middle East, Liberia, East and South Asia, Southeast Asia and Japan. Ministries include inviting people to be disciples of Jesus Christ and proclaiming God's reign of justice, peace and abundant life through education, economic development, medical care, abolishing global slavery, working with immigrants and refugees and teaching peace and justice. ABC International Ministries' website tells about the work of our Global Servants. I chose this example:

"Dan and Sarah Chetti work in Lebanon and are the first International Ministries global servants in the Arab world. Dan is an adjunct professor at the Arab Baptist Theological Seminary. Dan's current focus is promoting strategic Arab ministries in seven countries in the Middle East and North Africa, called "Enduring Love". Sarah has pioneered a ministry among foreign migrant women working as maids in Lebanon. She visits and ministers at three prisons, advocates for the rights of maids, fights human trafficking and runs an Integrated Centre for Migrant Domestic Workers, called INSAAF: Justice and Compassion of Jesus. Sarah's journals are available on the IM website. Due to the sensitive nature of Dan's *Enduring Love* newsletters, they are not posted online."

The **Retired Ministers and Missionaries Offering** is an opportunity to say "thank you" to retired pastors who have served our American Baptist churches and to the missionaries who have served as our hands and hearts in projects around the world. Our thank you gifts not only express our gratitude,

but help with the hardship of unexpected expenses such as medical problems, relocation or the death of a spouse. These faithful servants are often far from the church family that once supported them and appreciate being remembered.
