

Board of Trustees

Pastoral Relations Committee

The Pastoral Relations Committee (PRC) has two functions. First, it is the personnel committee for the pastoral staff. An example of this is the series of Let's Talk sessions sponsored by the PRC (in collaboration with the Church Council and the Racial Justice Team) on the topics of worship styles, church mission statement, and racial justice issues. Building Beloved Community Speaker Series

Sunday, April 24, 10:30 am During Worship



Muhammad Shahzad Hussain

Multifaith Outreach Coordinator Faith in Place | he/him

Shahzad belongs to the northern region of Pakistan where he spent most of his life. Trained as an Islamic scholar in the traditional Islamic seminaries (*madaris*), his intellectual pursuits are stretched along the lines of tradition, scholarship, and a deep commitment to global challenges.

Following his graduation from the seminaries, Shahzad made a scholarly contribution by coauthoring *The Untold Truth of Pakistan's Blasphemy Law*. This report not only compiles but critically examines the perspectives of traditional jurists from diverse Islamic Schools of Law on the sensitive issue of blasphemy. His academic exploration continued with M.Phil. research, where he delved into the complex topic of ISIS' (Islamic State of Iraq & Syria) notion of excommunication, viewed through the lens of al-Ghazali, an eleventh-century theologian and Sufi.

In the United States, Shahzad graduated from the University of Notre Dame, specializing in International Peace Studies. His transformative

internship at the World Hunger Relief Institute in Texas fueled his passion for regenerative practices and sustainability. It is reflected in the capstone project for his master's degree in which he developed a captivating children's handbook on gardening, written in his national language, Urdu.

Shahzad is also the co-founder of "hara bhara Haripur," a social media campaign dedicated to raising climate awareness in his hometown, Haripur, showing his commitment to grassroot change and community engagement.

In the midst of his dynamic pursuits, Shahzad finds balance and inner peace through meditative practices of Tai Chi and sketching.

The *Building Beloved Community Speaker Series*, which centers the voices of BIPOC leaders from various community sectors – each of them sharing their unique expertise and experiences with us, continues during the worship hour on the 4th Sunday of each month through 2024.

On our plant tours, you'll learn about our treatment process and how you can help protect our shared water resources." Your Green Team has reserved April 25, 2024, at 1:00 pm to tour these facilities. "The tour lasts for 1½ hours. The standard tour route includes stairs and a good deal of walking, sometimes on uneven surfaces and grass. Some parts of the route are not accessible to individuals with physical disabilities. However, with advance notice, we can make modifications to the route to accommodate all visitors." We will have a sign-up sheet and more specific directions at First Baptist Church.

Reflections of a New EV Owner

The technology of electric cars (EV) has intrigued me for several years. The advantages of being emission-free, reduced dependence on fossil fuels, lower maintenance costs, etc. are very attractive. But there is the problem of recharging the EV battery; the infrastructure for that is much less developed. We live in a condo and there are no electrical outlets in or near our parking space. So, we have passed on getting an EV. Recently it became clear that our 19-year-old gas-powered car had reached its end of life. We needed to buy a new car. Do we buy an EV or a gas-powered car? Our next car purchase would probably be our last car purchase; we tend to buy new cars and drive them until they fall apart. Given our advanced ages, either the state of Wisconsin or our children will revoke our driving privileges before the next car hits its end of life. Buy an EV? It is now, or never. In January we made the jump and bought an EV.

What's it like to drive an EV? With no gas engine the EV is very quiet. Because of the high torque electric motor and the lower center of gravity, the EV can be driven like a sports car. Take your foot off the "gas" pedal and the car slows down rather quickly because of regenerative braking; some EVs can be driven in a "one-pedal" mode with very little use of the brakes.

In short, an EV is fun to drive. Now we need to find a place to recharge the battery. I'll leave that story for another time.

FBC's Chinese Orphans Project

First Baptist Church started the Chinese Orphans Project in 2005 and has now changed the lives of 250+ impoverished rural orphans in China's Henan Province by providing funds for school and necessities needed to survive.

Today, there are 70 grateful orphans who are happily attending school with our funds. They range from grade school to college. We expect that all will graduate from high school, and most will go onto college. It's life-changing for these children who might not have gotten any education.

We work through Amity Foundation, a Chinese charity in Nanjing, and Judy Sutterlin, a retired ABC missionary who lived in China for 30 years. Judy, along with Linda Mintener and others traveled to China numerous summers to visit the orphans and bring back updates, grade reports, and photos. Our graduates are now teachers, engineers, computer specialists, accountants, nurses, machinists, mechanics, business owners, and even a jade carver.

We are now collecting for the 2024-25 school year. Your donation would not only help a child go to school, but also give inspiration, courage, and love to a child.



Wen, who will graduate from college this summer, tells what our funds have meant to her:


